Task 4: Moderate fourth focus group (key informants) to establish priorities

The UT SWORPS project manager prepared a summary of findings, shared this summary and other data with group participants, and moderated a focus group with key stakeholders and service providers (also referred to as key informants) to interpret findings from the community focus groups, household surveys, and other data collected from the 2010 Census, the 2012 County Health Rankings, the, and other relevant sources. This group's primary purpose was to identify the top service priorities for the RCUW. Participants included 11 community leaders, administrators from key service organizations in Roane County, and others knowledgeable about the needs of the community.

The fourth focus group of education, financial, and/or health stakeholders and subject matter experts were requested to look beyond their expertise and/or recognize overlaps between topics. The focus group was requested to vote on what they considered to be the top three needs. The table below depicts voting outcome. Three issues: generational dependency; limited use of social capital/social network (used in the context of live interpersonal connections, not social media networks); and increasing the number of jobs in the county were voted upon without defining the service gap. These were among the fourth focus group's top ranked issues (ranked as #2, #4, and #5 respectively). These issues are better defined as problems rather than service needs. Since there was not enough time during the focus group to discuss and define the service gaps in detail, these three problems will be addressed indirectly in the recommendations.

Additionally, increasing the number of jobs available within the county is a problem area not typically fulfilled by social services. The capacity of the local workforce and their education or skills level is a major deciding factor for increasing capacity at an existing company or locating a new company to a geographic area; and the education and training services currently provided in Roane County can positively impact the growth in the number of jobs which provide a "living wage."

As noted in the information provided above, generational dependency; limited use of social capital/social network (used in the context of live interpersonal connections, not social media networks); and increasing the number of jobs in the countywere issues were defined as problems rather than service needs due to the issues being very broad in scope. Addressing these issues will require close coordination among service providers and a variety of services to resolve the issues. For these reasons, the issues were not included in the final list of priorities. However strategies addressing the issues/problems are embodied within the results of this needs assessment.

Task 5: Present Needs Assessment Results and Recommendations

The RCUW and UT SWORPS project managers prepared this written report of findings, and the RCUW project manager will be responsible for presenting findings.

Transportation as a service gap permeated throughout all discussions and was determined to be a high priority in each and every focus group. The need has not changed since identified by the Nine Counties. One Vision need assessment which described the gap by focus group participants as specialized transportation services, while available, are not adequate to meet the need. Survey respondents at the same time echoed this concern, with 5.5 percent reporting not being able to get special transportation for an elderly or disabled person in the previous 12 months.

In this 2012 needs assessment 7.1% of survey respondents reported problems with transportation to services as a problem faced when trying to obtain help (reference question 3 of the household survey). The focus groups defined the specific gap within the transportation service need category as: "Transportation for general purposes for those 65 and older or disabled for groceries, banking, recreation, etc." The following are additional pertinent data supporting that transportation is a service gap/need.

- An increase in the elderly (65 and older) population within Roane County. Per the American Community Survey, approximately 18.1% (9,800 out of 54,277) of the population is over the age of 65.
- 5.8% of those over 65's income in the past 12 months are below the poverty level.
- Inability or election to not drive by the elderly individual.

It is recommended for RCUW to lead a community-wide effort to include SMEs and stakeholders as follow-on to this needs assessment to identify sustainable solution(s) for the transportation service gap of providing transportation for general purposes (groceries, banking, etc.) for those 65 and older or disabled in 2013. Factors for sustainable solutions include the minimum elements provided below:

- Process scope defined
- Process owner(s) to deliver the service(s)
- Process developed and piloted to remove inefficiencies
- Requirements agreed upon and documented
- Funding source(s) obtained

The recommendation's parameters are to assure the "solution" is not a temporary fix, but one which creates a model process used for years to come and one that reduces and/or eliminates the transportation service gap for those 65 years or older or disabled to meet basic living needs such as obtaining groceries, banking, etc.

The service gaps ranked 2 through 4 either have new processes currently being deployed and/or existing processes that adequately address the service gap. For example, the 2nd ranked service need of "Helping People Obtain Service(s) Which Meets Their Need(s)has the goal of establishing a way to identify individuals who are chronically dependent in Roane County (RC); then through case management, create a way to identify the root problems and lay out a plan towards stability. A new process directly supports fulfilling this need and this effort is briefly described below:

• A Roane County Referral Collaboration will pilot in January 2013, establishing a process for rent and utilities assistance with over ten organizations working together to deliver assistance efficiently for both the provider and the recipient. This collaborative effort works toward a vision of service providers working collectively, cohesively to deliver those services resulting in the greatest positive impact for the recipient. After the pilot is completed, lessons learned will be integrated to improve the process further and allow it to be transferrable to other types of assistance provided. The more organizations supporting this collaboration the easier it will be for those in need find/learn about the services they need.

A second process being deployed in January 2013 also supports fulfilling the need of "Helping People Obtain Service(s) Which Meets Their Need(s)" by providing another method used to communicate services provided in the county. The method is a volunteer database initiated in January 2013 for use by any Roane County non-profit. The Roane County Volunteer Clearinghouse is a user friendly web-based system focusing on matching volunteers with community events. The dual benefit of this database is that it becomes a communication tool to describe social services delivered in Roane County.

Whenever new processes are deployed, it is best not to attempt any changes, but to collect data which may be used to identify and determine where process improvements are needed. Therefore, it is

recommended that RCUW lead and/or assist with data collection through the first six months of the process deployments and then work with partners to identify if and what improvements are required.

The third ranked service need was described as Substance Abuse Prevention, Education, Family Support and Treatment and the gap was education for families, physicians, and community about identifying substance abuse and service options. Roane County Anti-Drug Coalition has maintained a strong and effective presence in the county since 2004. The Anti-Drug Coalition delivers ten programs and has plans to deliver a new program called Coping and Support Training (CAST) which uses an evidence-based group approach to decrease suicidal behaviors, depression and drug involvement among teens. It has been already approved via the 2013 RCUW allocation process for RCUW to fund the deployment of CAST.

Again, it is recommended for RCUW to work with the Roane County Anti-Drug Coalition and its other partners to assemble data as the new CAST program is deployed. It is also recommended that RCUW provide a forum, such as the interagency meeting, for the Anti-Drug Coalition to brainstorm solutions on how best to educate the medical community and the Roane County community at large on identification of substance abuse and service options. It would be beneficial to this recommended effort to partner with the Roane County Health Department, Ridgeview Psychiatric Hospital, and Covenant Health Hospital.

The UT's Extension Service recently completed a needs assessment which identified financial management as a need. The organization is in the planning stage to provide services within and outside of the school system. UT's Extension Service will provide monthly classes starting in 2013. This coincides with the fourth ranked service need of budgeting with a gap described as use of available services and budgeting skills by low-income families. It is recommended for RCUW to continue its partnership by assisting UT's Extension Service.

For the fifth and sixth service needs, it is recommended that RCUW defer addressing these needs until the first quarter of 2014. At that time the needs should be reassessed because it is believed that other RCUW initiatives will partially address these gaps. Attachment 3 provides the recommendations described above in an abbreviated format.

RCUW has met the goal established within the 2012 strategic plan of "A Roane County needs/gap analysis that identifies service priorities" defined within the RCUW 2012 Strategic plan process. This document describes the process and results of this project. The project not only identified service priorities, but has drafted recommendations for the RCUW Board of Directors' consideration.

This accomplishment could not have been completed on time and within budget without assistance from RCUW's staff, partnering service providers, community's subject matter experts, and stakeholders. All were invaluable to this effort. The co-leads of this project would like to thank all those who assisted in every way to accomplish this formidable task for the Roane County Community.
